Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the Bible we find many examples of people being underwater. The oldest text in the Hebrew Scriptures is the Book of Jonah, and we can all recall how it was that Jonah was thrown overboard from a ship in the Mediterranean and swallowed by a big fish. He survived. At the time of Noah when the floodwaters came up, Noah's family survived with pairs of every other living creature. In the Exodus, Moses and the former Hebrew slaves crossed the Red Sea without drowning, not so for the Egyptian army that followed. Joshua repeated this feat later crossing the Jordan to the Promised Land.

The encounters with water continue in the Gospels with the disciples of Jesus being saved from the storm on Galilee. In that scene, we watch Jesus actually walking over the water. Saint Paul is shipwrecked in Malta and survives with all hands aboard by turning all lives over to God. Furthermore, Jesus himself is baptized in the waters of the Jordan by John the Baptist. This is the sacrament that we employ today to welcome new believers to Faith in Christ.

Despite all of our biblical knowledge on the subject, I have counseled many of late that have come to me saying that they feel as if they are drowning right now. For one reason or another, they are not able to keep their heads above water. Perhaps you have felt that lately, too?

Maybe we are *not* going to keep our heads above water? If you have ever surfed or have been caught in a wave breaking over you in the ocean, and you are still reading this newsletter, then you have already discovered that being underwater is perfectly survivable—as long as you hold your breath and do not panic.

For the last few years while swimming laps for exercise, I have practiced swimming at least one lap underwater while holding my breath. Learning to breathe while swimming distances is one of the first things taught in swim lessons. Learning not to breathe while swimming may seem counter-intuitive. However, since practicing in this way, I have been caught under waves in the ocean and pinned to the seabed but have not panicked and have simply waited under the sea for my chance to surface again.

The ocean is huge and powerful. Sometimes it will toss me because I am flotsam in comparison. The ocean will do to me what it will. It is not a matter of surrendering to a fight. There is no fight with the ant underfoot. The ocean is not vengeful of me in the least. Nor should I take a riptide or wave break personally! The best that I can do is simply not panic and hold on to my breath.




